INTERCOLLEGIATE MINING COMPETITION

Sunshine Mine Disaster

On the 2nd of May 1972 an underground fire broke out in the Sunshine Mine. Located between Kellogg and Wallace in northern Idaho, USA, the mine once produced silver, copper and antimony and was the nation's leading silver producer for some time before its eventual closure in 2001. 173 miners were working underground at the time the fire broke out. As carbon monoxide, heat and smoke spread rapidly throughout the mine an evacuation was called. Only 80 men were able to escape; 91 died of carbon monoxide poisoning while the remaining 2 men who managed to find a safe spot underground were rescued on May 8th

The Sunshine fire was the largest mining disaster since the 1917 fire in Montana which claimed 163 lives.

The Competition

In 1978 the International Collegiate Mining Competition was started to honor not only those who perished or lost a loved one in the Sunshine Mine disaster, but also those who had lost a loved one in any mining related incident. The competition is centered around the traditional mining techniques that were used in the industry at the time of the Sunshine Disaster and consists of 7 events; Air Leg, Muck, Hand Steel, Swede Saw, Survey, Gold Pan, and Track Stand. Snapshots of the events can be seen on the following page.

A competition like no other, the Mining Games sees universities from all over the world including the USA, Europe, Brazil, and Australia come together to not only compete, but also to build an international network and learn both the culture and mining techniques of the aforementioned nations. Hosting of the games is shared between various schools in the USA, the UK and WASM Kalgoorlie.



Training Shirt Design




Competition Shirt Design

WASM Wombats to test mining mettle at this weekend's Export Cup in Kalgoorlie

Kalgoorlie-Boulder students will put their knowledge of old school mine techniques to the test against a Perth-based outfit at Hannans North Tourist Mine this weekend.

The annual Export Cup pitches the WA School of Mines Wombats against Perth's WASM Wallabies for the title of State mining games champions.

Three teams – two from Kalgoorlie-Boulder and one from Perth – will contest the title this year.

WASM Wombats president Sydney Kamerman said the local team had been flat-out preparing for the event to end an interrupted year on a high.

"With COVID-19 hitting in March our competition in America got cancelled six days before we were meant to fly out which was ... devastating," she said.

"We stopped training from March until August ... and are now trying to get a couple of trainings in a week and just keeping the positivity and Wombat spirit going.

"Because lots of us will be graduating this is about trying to keep it going so once we are finished the new people coming through will still know what it is about and be able to run it."

The event has teams competing against each other in categories from gold panning and mucking to airleg drilling.

It's open to the public and starts 8am on Sunday.
